FROM THE **BOARD OF** DIRECTORS

SEWER PROJECT UPDATE On behalf of the Board of Directors of Sacramento B.P.O. Elks #6, I would like to thank all of you for putting up with and tolerating the confusion and mess, through the month of April, associated with the sewer construction project.

In March 2017, the officers of the Lodge contacted Grand Lodge requesting a permit to repair and replace the deteriorating sewer system, which was granted. At the same time, CHEA representatives and the CHEA Insurance and Safety Chairman contacted the Lodge officers and informed them that the sewer project and other related repairs, were to be managed by the BPOE #6 Board of Directors alone. In addition, we were told to hire a General Contractor to add an additional layer of liability in case of accidents as well as overseeing any additional contractors needed for the project.

Our property insurance provider, AON Insurance and Gallagher Bassett Services, provided an insurance payment of \$193,000 for the damages incurred. The Trenchless Company was hired to do the sewer work and Pinnacle Construction was hired as the General Contractor. Work began on April 3, and proceeded on schedule through the month of April. Our goal was to have the project completed, at least in the main part of the building, in time to host our annual Cinco de Mayo event and that goal was met. A few areas remained incomplete and include areas in the fitness center (the men's shower, a strip on the floor between the woman's locker room) and the boiler room, a small



MYSTERIES AROUND THE LODGE (part 1)


TRIVIA, CLUES AND THINGS YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW

The original #6 started on February 25, 1877.

Trivia Question: What does Edwin Booth (famed actor and brother of John Wilks Booth, the assassin of President Abraham Lincoln), have to do with the original #6? Edwin Booth, recited the Lord's Prayer at the "club activities" (banquet) on the night our Lodge was instituted in 1877.

Trivia Note: Edwin Booth was politically the opposite of his brother and was a Unionist. Edwin is also accredited with saving the life of Robert Todd Lincoln (President's son), as documented by Robert Todd Lincoln. One of the installing officers for our new lodge was Thomas Keane PER of Lodge #3 and a renowned actor in his own right.

Trivia Note: The 11th Hour Toast "To Our Absent Members," actually started our Original Lodge 6. What might sound like the set up for an old joke, the abridged story is this: Hank Lathrop (brother-inlaw of the former Governor of California and a U.S. Senator, Leland Stanford) and a friend, Wentworth T. Crowell, had gone



members of the Elks. When asked what that means, Senator McCarthy explained that it's the Elk's salute to 11 o'clock, to honor those who have departed and those not here. Impressed, Crowell asked more about the Elks. A chance meeting and discussion resulted in a group joining San Francisco Lodge #3 and petitioning for a new Lodge in Sacramento. Wentworth Crowell was the first ER, Charles Coglin (county clerk) was Leading Knight, Hank Lathrop was Loyal Knight, and Isador Townsend was an officer (title not specified) of the original #6. Hank Lathrop later was an ER of the original #6 (date unknown).

Trivia Question: Did Lathrop, the Stanford's and perhaps, the Crocker family, have anything to do with some of the art work at our current Lodge?

As any property owner will tell you, plumbing problem can be expensive, and happen at the most inappropriate times. With recent plumbing repairs in our current lodge, I thought this might be of interest. In 1913 at our lodge located at 824 J Street a water pipe broke on the 5th floor. At the time the Elks were holding a dance on a lower floor. Described as "letting a veritable Niagara down on the dancers," the repairs followed in "a few weeks." What some may not know that building had a garden, a golf driving range, sand trap and a putting green on its roof.

In July 1911 our Lodge Bulletin "The Six" was first published. Happy birthday to The Six.



M2M MONTHLY TIPS

DIVERSIFY WITH BONDS (EVEN IF RATES ARE LOW) — Although interest rates may be rising, they're still low by historical standards. So, is it worthwhile to invest in fixed-rate investments such as bonds?

Actually, you can benefit from owning bonds, no matter what's happening with interest rates. Bonds frequently move in a different direction than stocks, so bond ownership may help protect your portfolio somewhat from a sharp decline in the financial markets. Furthermore, as long as the issuer doesn't default, a bond will pay you a steady stream of income. And

you will receive all your principal back if you hold the bond until maturity.

Still, bonds do carry their own types of risk. For example, if interest rates rise, the value of your existing bonds might fall. That's why you may want to build a "ladder" containing shortand long-term bonds. When your short-term bonds mature, you can reinvest the proceeds into new bonds that may pay higher rates, while your longer-term bonds will pay you the higher rate at which they were issued.
